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SYNOPSIS AND LIST OF DATES

The present Pro-bono Public Interest Litigation under Article 32 of the Constitution of India is being filed to safeguard mainly for Women Advocates the Fundamental Right to Work guaranteed under Article 19 (1)(g) in a conducive atmosphere as ensured under Article 21 for that there is denial of Equality or equal opportunity as enshrined under Articles 14 & 15 of the Constitution of India. Women Advocates' presence in the legal workforce is growing, accounting for roughly 15.31% of total registered Advocates, yet the lived realities of Women Advocates reveal a different story. There are either no dedicated Ladies' Bar Rooms (hereinafter referred as 'LBR'), or the specified area termed as Ladies Bar Rooms are lacking even in basic provisions including changing rooms, attached creches and washrooms with hygiene (so that Women Advocates have a comfortable and secure environment to sit/take rest breaks between the court hearings/contribute with full participation in the profession with all round development in a conducive environment as a collaborative tool, denial whereof results in Women Advocates facing systemic marginalization, exclusion from vital professional networking and this hostile atmosphere forces Women Advocates to operate as Visitors in their own Workplace, thereby on the one hand undermines the substantive Equality at workplace guaranteed under Articles 14, 15, 19 (1) (g) and 21 of the Constitution of India and on the other hand also discourages Families to send their daughters and sisters to practise on a regular basis in the Lower Courts especially devoid of such basic provisions.

Further the Freshers at the Bar concentrating in the Courts at prominent Cities including daily owing to insufficient stipends paid at the Local Courts.

The Women Advocates practicing without dedicated workspaces creates an unequal professional playing field, while the subpar

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infrastructure acts as a systematic barrier, discouraging Women Advocates from advancing in local litigation. Moreover, access to dedicated basic space with privacy is intrinsically linked to bodily autonomy, personal health, and human dignity. The Women Advocates need enclosure/dressing room/changing station to wear their robes, to handle paperwork safely, access charging stations for digital legal tools, store their legal attire.

The primary responsibility for development of infrastructure facilities for High Courts, District and Subordinate Courts, Tribunals rests with the State Governments/UTs. However, to augment the resources of States/UTs, Central Government has been implementing a Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) for the Development of Infrastructure Facilities for Judiciary in the District and Subordinate Courts since 1993-94, by providing financial assistance in the prescribed fund sharing pattern between the Centre and States/UTs. The Scheme covers five components, namely, Court Halls, Residential Units for Judicial Officers, Lawyer's Halls, Toilet Complexes and Digital Computer Rooms. Even though the funds are earmarked the Courts below still do not have ample infrastructure to support the Women workforce in the legal profession as per the data collected.

India, being a signatory to Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW), is under an obligation to take appropriate measures to eliminate discrimination against Women in public and professional life. Article 11 of CEDAW mandate effective participation of Women in public functions and ensure Equality in Employment, including access to opportunities, training, and advancement.

“Article 11:

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“States Parties shall take all appropriate measures to eliminate discrimination against women in the field of employment in order to ensure, on a basis of equality of men and women, the same rights, in particular:

(a) The right to work as an inalienable right of all human beings;

(b) xxx xxx xxx

(c) The right to free choice of profession and employment, the right to promotion, job security and all benefits and conditions of service and the right to receive vocational training and retraining, including apprenticeships, advanced vocational training and recurrent training;

(d)-(e) xxx xxx xxx

*(f) **THE RIGHT TO PROTECTION OF HEALTH AND TO SAFETY IN WORKING CONDITIONS, INCLUDING THE SAFEGUARDING OF THE FUNCTION OF REPRODUCTION.***

2. In order to prevent discrimination against women on the grounds of marriage or maternity and to ensure their effective right to work, States Parties shall take appropriate measures:

(a) To prohibit, subject to the imposition of sanctions, dismissal on the grounds of pregnancy or of maternity leave and discrimination in dismissals on the basis of marital status;

(b) xxx xxx xxx

*(c) To encourage the provision of the necessary supporting social services to enable parents to combine family obligations with work responsibilities and participation in **PUBLIC LIFE, IN PARTICULAR THROUGH PROMOTING THE ESTABLISHMENT AND DEVELOPMENT OF A NETWORK OF CHILD-CARE FACILITIES;***

(d) To provide special protection to women during pregnancy in types of work proved to be harmful to them.

3. Protective legislation relating to matters covered in this article shall be reviewed periodically in the light of scientific

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and technological knowledge and shall be revised, repealed or extended as necessary.”

Notably, the United Nations through agencies like UN Women, UNICEF, and the International Labour Organization (ILO), strongly advocates for dedicated private and safe spaces in the workplace for women professionals even for feeding babies. But in Courts there are instances that the Advocates have to leave their babies under the supervision of colleague or lady constables around, while they attend the Court hearings.

The Petitioners are practising advocates at Delhi-NCR Courts (Rohini in Delhi, Ghaziabad in U.P. and Gurgaon in Haryana), Nagpur, Maharashtra, Patna, Bihar. Petitioner no. 1, 2 & 3 had met Dr. Monika Gusain, Senior Advocate, Chairperson of Ladies Welfare and Ladies Bar Room Sub-Committee of Executive Committee of SCBA during her visits to Lower Courts while the Chairperson was passionately and enthusiastically working on National Survey: Documentary Voices of Women Legal Professionals in India. During those meetings, the Petitioners highlighted the common problem of NO SPECIFIC DEDICATED SPACE / insufficient provisions for Women Advocates in majority of nearby Courts in Delhi-NCR. Recently it has been in media reports that an Advocate Ms. Anita Jha famously known as “Lincoln Lawyer” practising in Madhubani Courts, Bihar for past 13 Years from her Car that operates as her Mobile Office. Though Ms. Jha adopted this mobile setup as a protest after being denied a formal chamber on the court premises, but if there is dedicated space for Women Advocates inside Court complexes like well-equipped LBR where they could share knowledge, hold discussions on latest judgments, and take rest breaks, in between cases listed before the different Courts located within the Court Complex, it would be beneficial for one and all and also result in better administration of Justice over a period of time. Infact the meeting on 03.02.2026 by Petitioner no. 1 and her colleagues with the Chairperson of Ladies Welfare and Ladies Bar Room Sub-Committee had also to be conducted in Library of the Ghaziabad District Court. The team of advocates accompanying the

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Chairperson were shocked to observe that the premises in Ghaziabad District Court (35 kms from this Hon'ble Court) though is having space marked for Ladies Bar Room but is used as a storeroom. Repeated oral and written representation led by Petitioner No. 1 has ensued no response from the District Bar Office bearers, Court administration.

Same is the situation witnessed at District Courts at Gurgaon, Faridabad in Haryana, Rohini District Courts in Delhi. The insufficiency of basic provisions in LBRs in the different District Courts in Delhi-NCR led to formulation of the FORM for Basic Provisions and amenities conceptualised by the Chairperson describing the mandatory basic provisions required for any LBR and modern amenities that could be discretionary (for example Provision of Air Purifier, a necessity in Delhi NCR but carpet may be a necessity in Courts located in the Himalayan range). The contents of the FORM are based on the study of the basic Provisions and amenities as available for the Women Advocates in the Ladies Bar Room within the main Complex of this Hon'ble Court and the Delhi High Court. During the brainstorming done, it was observed that apart from High Court benches, there are 797 districts in the Entire Country and about 7090 sub-districts. As the effort is to collect precise information while ensuring adequate representation of maximum number of Women Advocates throughout the Country to gather information at large scale on following issues: -

1. Whether specific Ladies Bar Room exists with ample Space in proportion of number of Women Advocates practising in a given Court Complex or not?
2. If yes, whether it has sufficient basic provisions for the lady advocates practicing in the said Court/Tribunal Complex?
3. If yes further, whether it has modern amenities anticipated as per the requirement and expectations in view of the dignity

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of the Profession and the peculiar requirement existing e.g., Air purifier is a necessity in Ladies Bar Room in District Courts in Delhi NCR owing to AQI being 250+ at times but Carpet is a necessity in the Courts in mountains.

A comprehensive, official list of exactly which District and sub-Divisional Court lack designated Ladies' Bar Room is not available as is not publicly published, however, it is a widely acknowledged issue across the Country that many High Courts, subordinate District Court Complexes, especially in rural and sub-Divisional areas still lack basic dedicated Ladies' Bar Rooms for Women Advocates.

The required information was collected by way of the STRATIFIED CLUSTER RANDOM SAMPLING DATA COLLECTION METHOD whereby efforts were made by a few Advocates alongwith the Petitioners, to achieve the target of gathering information atleast from 2 Districts /Tehsil Court in each State apart from High Courts and in the process collect information from a wide spectrum of Courts throughout the Country. This information was to be collected by way of Physical visits/one to one information gathered from Local Advocates practising in respective Courts / from any other reliable source. The slow pace of availability of responses led to adoption of Trial and Error Method to create a Google Link on the Form for Basic Provisions and Amenities and circulate it to ensure it reaches maximum number of Women Advocates throughout the Country. The information collected is from 69 District and Talukas of 797 districts totalling to 8.4+% and 7 High Courts. It has been summarised in the table given below:

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Welfare and institutional safeguards for the Women Advocates who are practising is essential and is intrinsically connected to access to Justice, equal representation and independence of the Women Professionals that form part of the Constitutional Structure. The Petitioners therefore invokes the extraordinary jurisdiction of this Hon'ble Court to ensure that a safe, equitable and supportive environment for Women Advocates is created by mandating creation of a well functional & equipped LBR in all High Courts, District & Taluka Courts Commissions, Tribunals throughout the country as it directly affects their ability to function that in turn determines access to justice for public and the smooth administration of justice. The Women Advocates are disheartened by repeated conduct of the stalwarts of the Bar who on the eve of the Bar Elections make tall promises to provide basic provisions in LBR and the same even if provided become defunct and inoperative within a couple of months.

In the light of the above it is submitted that a dedicated Ladies bar room for Women Advocates is a tangible step reflecting the Judiciary's commitment to foster a more inclusive environment for female Legal Professionals.

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approval of plans for construction of modern Judicial Court Complex at AMB, Himachal Pradesh in a such a manner that it can cater the need in future for 50 years –

“The Additional Chief Secretary (Home) to the Government of Himachal Pradesh is directed to issue necessary administrative approval and expenditure sanction within 10 days.

The District and Sessions Judge, Una will convene a meeting within one week, to be attended by Deputy Commissioner, Una, Superintending Engineer, H.P. P.W.D., Una, a Senior Architect from the Department of Architecture, Sub Divisional Officer (Civil), Amb and Tehsildar, Amb to inspect the proposed site of the new Judicial Court Complex at Amb and resolve the issue, if any pending rt o in relation thereto. There shall be a direction to the State Government that no impediment shall be caused in the selection of the site which should be sufficient enough to cater the need of Judicial Institution for next 40-50 years or

As soon as the site is demarcated, which shall be within one week, the Department of Architect will issue the drawings within two weeks. The Department of H.P.P.W.D. shall prepare the estimate within two weeks thereafter and the tender must be floated for allotment of work, in no circumstances beyond 28th February, 2019.

The State Government shall continue to sanction additional budget, as may be required, uninterruptedly and well in advance, for completion of the Project.

The Judicial Court Complex shall be completed in all respect before 31st March, 2020.

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The Department of Architecture shall ensure that all basic amenities like; rt o (a) separate toilets for women and men, ramp and other facilities for the specially abled persons; (b) open and sitting space for senior citizens; (c) a space for the Public Prosecutors; (d) Bar Association Room, Library, Canteen separately for the Members of the Bar and litigants be provided.

In case the proposed Judicial Court Complex will be multi-storeyed, in that event, adequate lifts will be installed to ensure that specially abled persons and senior citizens are able to visit Court Rooms on all the floors.

The State Government shall consider the request of the Members of the Bar for earmarking separate sites for construction of the Chambers, in accordance with Government Policy. It will be expedient if such sites are allotted rt o simultaneously. It shall be ensured that adequate parking space is provided.

The Building Committee of the High Court is requested to periodically monitor construction work of the Complex.”

26.06.2023 The Nilgiris’s District Bar Association (NDBA) inaugurated a special room for Women Lawyers at the newly constructed combined District Court Complex in Udthagamandalam.

23.01.2026 It has been reported in media that Woman Advocate Ms. Anita Jha has been practising in Madhubani for past 13 Years from her Car that operates as a Mobile Office.

2024 – 2026 Representations were made to Authorities of various District Courts and Bar Associations, besides verbal appeals by Women Advocates to mitigate the difficulties being faced but the apathetic response disheartened the Women Advocates.

The Advocates esp freshers need to be encouraged to spend a few initial years at Lower courts .The same requires the improvement in basic infrastructure as well as creation of a “Young Members Corpus Fund” at each Court by the

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respective Bar associations, wherein stipend be provided to the fresher advocates in their first year . The initial corpus can be funded by tax free proportional contributions from the advocates having more than 40 years practice in the Said Bar. The fresher advocates at the time of issuance of the enrolment certificate from the State Bar Council, would be required to furnish an undertaking that the stipend thus availed by them in the initial first year, shall be reimbursed/ repaid by them anywhere between 11th-13th years of their practice into the Corpus, failing which stringent action will be called for by the Bar Council.

Jan –

April 2026 The Chairperson of Ladies Welfare and Ladies Bar Room Sub - Committee of Executive Committee of SCBA met the Present Petitioners during visits to District Courts at Ghaziabad, Gurgaon, Faridabad, and Rohini. During those meetings in the District Courts, the Present Petitioners again highlighted the common problem of NO SPACE / insufficient basic provisions for Women Advocates in majority of nearby Districts and Taluka level courts in Delhi NCR.

Subsequently, the team of advocates accompanied the above-mentioned Chairperson to visit various District Courts including at Panipat, Kurukshetra, Karnal, Ambala, Rohtak in Haryana, Rohini District Court, Delhi and Mathura District Court (Ladies Bar Room and washroom are reportedly generally kept locked in Mathura) Uttar Pradesh during Cour hours also. The team shared the FORM of Basic Provisions and Hi-Tech Gadgets/Amenities at the LBR, circulated that was filled by the lady advocates on voluntary basis who

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are practising at the respective Bars for considerable number of years and are well versed with the ground realities.

The issue of structural disadvantages faced by Woman Advocates needs to be addressed as the practising Women Advocates face daily physical and professional hardships caused by missing infrastructure.

On the other hand, the Ladies Bar Room at District Panipat, Rohtak, Haryana stand out as they provide even for Double Bed, single bed for the Lady Advocates to take rest in case of some medical emergency.

There is no centralised National Database explicitly quantifying exactly how many of India's District Court complexes/tribunals/commissions provide a dedicated Ladies' Bar Room or Lounge.

However, studies - including the Supreme Court's Centre for Research and Planning and reports by the India Justice Report – point out that a majority of District Courts and Taluka/Tehsil Courts/Commissions/Tribunals across the country lack sufficient Gender-sensitive infrastructure, separate spaces for Woman Advocates especially in Trial Courts. There is no published data detailing the exact number of Tehsils or Talukas across India that lack a dedicated Ladies' Bar Room for Women Advocates.

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There is need for inspection panels to be constituted by the High Courts to address the issue of lack of separate Bar Rooms for Woman Advocates practising in all the Courts throughout the respective States.

03.06.2026 That in view of the above absence of Ladies' Bar Room and inconsistencies in the basic provisions, not to mention about amenities in the Ladies Bar Rooms, that infact either are not available in every district Court (or are locked even during Court Hours and thus not available conveniently) not to mention the inconvenience being caused in the creches by way of having untrained and insensitive attendants followed by non - availability of provision of specific space availability for nursing of their babies by Women Advocates and Lady clients during Court Hours , absence of attached clean washrooms. Therefore the Petitioners being Advocates of considerable standing at respective Courts take it as their bounden duty to bring the issues, concerns and suggestions on the basis of drive initiated mainly by way of Form of Basic Provisions and Amenities for all the Women Advocates practising in any Court / Tribunal / Commission throughout the Country to seek appropriate directions and remedies.

MOST RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

1. That the Petitioner No. 1 enrolled with the Bar Council of U.P. as is well versed with the ground realities of the difficulties being faced by the Women Advocates practising in various District Courts, Taluka Courts, Tehsil Courts, Tribunal, Commissions in Western Uttar Pradesh and is practising at District Courts Ghaziabad for the last 24 years. The Petitioner No. 2 is practising for last 15 years mainly at District Courts Gurugram, Haryana. The Petitioner No. 3 is practising mainly at District Courts at Delhi for the last 13 years. The Petitioner No. 4 is practising mainly at District Courts Faridabad, Haryana for the last 16 years. The Petitioner No. 5 is practising mainly at District Courts Nagpur, Maharashtra for the last 9 years. The Petitioner No. 6 is practising mainly at District Courts Patna, Bihar for the last 5 years. (*Documents are Annexed from Pages 80 to 102 respectively of the Petition*).
2. That the Petitioners have locus standi for the present PIL as the cause involved is in Public Interest, without any personal gain, private motive or oblique motive. The Petitioners has not filed any similar or identical Petition earlier.

- a. That the cause of action of the Petition pertains to the abysmal situation in majority of Courts throughout the country that through Women Advocates account for roughly 15.31% of total registered advocates in the Country, yet there are either no dedicated LBR, or the cramped LBRs are lacking even in basic provisions denying comfortable and secure and conducive environment to sit and take rest breaks between the court hearings/actively have full participation in the profession.
 - b. The above situation subjects the Women Advocates practising in courts without a full-fledged LBR facing systemic marginalization, exclusion from vital professional networking. Lack of basic provisions and amenities at the workplace, that result in creating a hostile atmosphere forcing Women Advocates to operate as Visitors in their own Workplace, while the families of the Women Advocates feel discouraged to send their Daughters and Sisters to practise in Courts devoid of such basic provisions.
 - c. That the Women Advocates at Ghaziabad, Rohini, Mathura and Faridabad had made representations in the year 2024 - 2026 to the Authorities of District Courts and Bar Associations, besides verbal appeals by Women Advocates to mitigate the difficulties being faced but the apathetic response disheartened the Women Advocates. In the case of Rohini the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi approved Rs. 8.5 lakhs and LC was sent. Due to extreme urgency and considering the needs of Women Advocates the Petitioners are approaching this Hon'ble Court directly.
3. That there is no civil, criminal or revenue litigation, involving the petitioner or any of the petitioners, which has or could

have a legal nexus with the issue(s) involved in the public interest litigation.

4. That the primary responsibility for development of infrastructure facilities for High Courts, District and Subordinate Courts rests with the State Governments/UTs, and High Courts. However, to augment the resources of States/UTs, Central Government has been implementing a Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) for the Development of Infrastructure Facilities for Judiciary in the District and Subordinate Courts since 1993-94, by providing financial assistance in the prescribed fund sharing pattern between the Centre and States/UTs. The Scheme covers five components, namely, Court Halls, Residential Units for Judicial Officers, Lawyer's Halls, Toilet Complexes and Digital Computer Rooms. Even though the funds are earmarked the District and Subordinate Courts still do not have infrastructure to support the Women workforce in the legal profession.
5. That India, being a signatory to Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW), is under an obligation to take appropriate measures to eliminate discrimination against Women in public and professional life. Article 11 of CEDAW mandate effective participation of women in public functions and ensure equality in employment, including access to opportunities, training, and advancement.
6. That due to lack of infrastructural support, the Women Advocates either abruptly discontinue their practise or set up their office in borrowed spaces resulting in unnecessary financial burden on them.

7. That the Chairperson of Ladies Welfare and Ladies Bar Room Sub-Committee of Executive Committee of SCBA met the Present Petitioners during her visits to District Courts at Ghaziabad, Gurgaon, Faridabad, Rohini in Delhi – NCR, wherein, the Present Petitioners highlighted the common problem of NO SPACE / cramped space available for Women Advocates in majority of Courts. Infact in Ghaziabad District Court small room marked for LBR is being used as a storeroom and the Faridabad, Gurgaon, Rohini Ladies Bar Room are not well devoid of the basic provisions. The Courts at Kurukshetra, Karnal, Ambala, Rohtak, Haryana, Rohini District Court, Delhi and Mathura District Court (Ladies Bar Room is generally kept locked even during Courts hours), U.P. were subsequently visited and it was found that either the District Courts do not have LBR facility or the amenities provided in the LBR in the District Courts were minimal. The FORM OF BASIC PROVISIONS AND AMENITIES at the LBR conceptualised by the Chairperson was filled by the Lady Advocates on voluntary basis.

8. GROUND:

The Present PIL is filed before this Hon'ble Court inter alia, on the following grounds: -

- A. Because it ought to be appreciated that on the one hand this Hon'ble Court has mandated for minimum 3-year of legal practise as an eligibility requirement to appear for Civil Judge Examination. But the absence of basic provisions for Women Advocates in various High Courts and District Courts discourages the families to send their daughters and sisters to practise on a regular basis in various High Courts, District Courts / Tehsil / Taluka Courts devoid of such basic provisions resulting in violation of the Fundamental Right to Equality under Article 14 , Right to Profession under Article 19 (1) (g) in a conducive atmosphere to work under Article 21 of the Constitution for the Women Advocates.

- B. Because it ought to be appreciated that the Right to Life under Article 21 includes the right to social security and professional dignity. The provision of LBR having all the basic provisions is a positive obligation of the Respondents, to ensure dignified conditions of practice for the Bar as such.
- C. Because it ought to be appreciated that the Constitution of India imposes a duty on the State to improve Public Health, raise the standard of living, and increase the level of nutrition, as outlined in Article 47 under the Directive Principles of State Policy. In absence of proper place to relax or sit comfortably the Women Advocates over a period of time develop UTI, and suffer from other medical ailments etc.
- D. Because it ought to be appreciated that the United Nations through agencies like UN Women, UNICEF, and the International Labour Organization (ILO), strongly advocates for dedicated private and safe spaces in the workplace for women professionals for nursing babies. In a very few Courts like Sonipat, Hr, and Vidisha, MP there is a chamber earmarked solely for breast feeding by Lady Advocates during Court hours.
- E. Because it ought to be appreciated that information has been gathered from various reliable sources from about 68+ District and Taluka Courts throughout the Country and few High Courts whereby it is clear that various Courts throughout the Country suffer from acute infrastructural lack and systemic neglect for Women Advocates. Inadequate or absence of common rooms/designated lounges / LBR directly violates Fundamental Right to a dignified workplace for Women Advocates in legal Profession whereby it is res ipsa loquitor that India a developing economy, lacks dignified

amenities for Women Advocates practising in different Courts, often depicts parallel condition seen in severely underdeveloped or resource starved regions globally.

- F. Because it ought to be appreciated that the number of Women Advocates is increasing day by day but the infrastructural support for them is still in nascent stage. Women Advocates deserve professional spaces that honour their dignity and daily needs. A dedicated LBR is a basic requirement for safety, comfort and productivity and not a mere luxury. In several Lower Courts in India, the facilities provided in the name of LBR are merely token or nominal in nature, lacking even the most basic provisions as sufficient number of tables, chairs, proper ventilation, direct access to LBR required for dignified and effective use by Women Advocates. The District Courts at Gurugram, Rohini, Faridabad, Nagpur lack even Basic Provisions in the LBRs in as much as even if amenities such as TV, though exists but are generally not operational as will not have recharges, a Heater e.g, during winters will be defunct as The basic provisions in the LBR are generally replenished by Prominent members of the Bar on the eve of bar election that generally have short life. Further, even basic provisions such as sufficient number of CLEAN western-style toilet seats are absent, resulting in serious hardship, to Pregnant, senior and elderly Women Advocates who particularly may suffer from UTI and have no choice but to use Indian squat toilet pan while suffering from knee stiffness and other age-related mobility issues. Eg., In Mathura District Courts, the LBR inaugurated in 2023-2024, and Ladies Washroom are generally kept locked even during Court hours, forcing the Women Advocates to use Pink Toilet.

- G. Because it ought to be appreciated that as per the information gathered from reliable sources the District Courts of Muzaffarpur in Bihar, Ghaziabad Tehsil, Modinagar Tehsil, Aligarh District Courts, Kasganj District Courts of U.P. have a significant number of Women Advocates, however as on date, no LBR are available therein and that this issue extends to High Court, several other Trial Courts across the Country.
- H. Because it ought to be appreciated that the Advocates especially freshers need to be encouraged to spend a few initial years at Lower Courts. The same requires the improvement in basic infrastructure as well as creation of a “Young Members Corpus Fund” at each Court by the respective Bar associations, wherein stipend be provided to the fresher Advocates especially Women Advocates in their first year. The initial corpus can be funded by tax free proportional contributions from the advocates having more than 40 years practice in the Said Bar. The fresher advocates at the time of issuance of the enrolment certificate from the State Bar Council, would be required to furnish an undertaking that the stipend thus availed by them in the initial first year, shall be reimbursed/ repaid by them anywhere between 11th – 13th years of their practice into the Corpus, failing which stringent action will be called for by the Bar Council.
- I. Because it ought to be appreciated that the Ministry of Women & Child Development and Ministry of Labour & Employment has recently released *National Minimum Standards and Protocol for Crèches (Operation and Management)* that aims to provide guidance to Corporations / Companies / Universities / Hospitals / Government Organizations / NGOs etc., mandated under various Acts and Rules of the Government of India to set up Creches. These Standards and Protocol focus strongly on standardizing and

institutionalizing the Care economy, contributing significantly to the vision of 'Women-led Development'.

9. PRAYERS:

In view of the facts and circumstances stated above, the Petitioners most respectfully prays that this Hon'ble Court may be pleased to: -

- A. Issue appropriate writ, order or direction to the Respondents Hon'ble High Courts to constitute in every Bench of the Hon'ble High Court, a Committee consisting of minimum 2 Women Advocates practicing before respective Bench of the Hon'ble High Court alongwith a Lady Officer from the Registry of the respective Bench of the Hon'ble High Court to conduct inspection within their own Court complexes and submit an exhaustive infrastructure report regarding the provisions and amenities available in the Ladies' Bar Rooms therein in a time-bound manner; and/or
- B. Issue appropriate writ, order or direction to the Respondents Hon'ble High Courts to direct all District Judges under their jurisdiction to submit an exhaustive baseline infrastructure report regarding Ladies' Bar Rooms in each Tehsil Court, Tribunals, Commissions, falling within the District Court in a time bound manner, apart from the District Court itself, about the availability of Ladies Bar Room having atleast basic provisions conducive to the local climate, geographical conditions, physical distance, digital modernisation and other requirements; and/or
- C. Issue appropriate writ, order or direction to the Respondents to ensure that all the High Courts, District Courts, Tehsil Courts throughout the Country immediately, in furtherance of the report prepared as prayed for in Prayer A and B hereinabove, have a dedicated spacious Ladies Bar Room with basic operational

Provisions in view of number of registered Women Advocates as registered members of Local Bar Associations in a time-bound manner; and/or

- D. Issue appropriate writ, order or direction to the Respondents to ensure that the latest amenities including lifts, ramp wheresoever required for the dedicated Ladies Bar Room in the High Courts, District Courts, Tehsil Courts, Tribunals, Commissions throughout the Country are provided in a time bound manner; and/or
- E. Issue appropriate writ, order or direction to the Respondents to ensure that every new or existing Court Complex design must reserve a fixed, designated area for Women Advocates in a such a manner that it can cater the need in future for 50 years; and/or
- F. Issue appropriate writ, order or direction to the Respondents to create dedicated, private, hygienic, safe, and accessible breastfeeding/ nursing facilities within Ladies Bar Room as well as within visitor and public waiting areas in Court, Tribunal, Commission complexes; and/or
- G. Issue appropriate writ, order or direction(s) to the Respondents to allocate designated independent Funds for setting up of Spacious Ladies Bar Rooms having basic operational provisions and updated amenities in a time-bound manner; and/or
- H. Issue appropriate writ, order or direction to the Respondents to conduct periodic inspections to ensure that the basic provisional and amenities made available in Ladies Bar Room are throughout properly maintained and are in operational mode; and/or
- I. Issue appropriate writ, order or direction to the Respondents to create a tax-free Young Members Corpus Fund at each Bar/ State Bar Council to ensure release of fix stipend to the Young Advocates especially Women Advocates in their first year of enrolment as per Ground H of the Petition; and/or

- J. Issue appropriate order or direction to the Respondents as interim measure to provide immediate temporary arrangements as partitioned spaces or portable setups until the permanent infrastructure is provided in terms of the above prayers A-G; and/or
- K. Pass any other order as deemed necessary in the interest of Women Advocates.
